Then, use books or the internet to find out facts about creatures that live under the sea. Make a fact book about your chosen creatures.

Maths

This week the children will be learning about halving. You might like to have a go at one or more of the following activities:

1. During snack time ask your child how they might halve different food items. You might use a small amount of raisins, an apple, a banana, a carton of juice, a chocolate bar.
2. Watch Sesame Street - Ernie's half eaten sandwich.

4. Listen to the story 'Give me half' <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=hVaxiJB6Fls>
5. Cut out a selection of paper shapes (circle, square, rectangle, triangle). Ask your child to fold the shapes in half. Ask your child to check that the folded shape is equal on each side. Then ask your child what they notice: "Has the shape changed?" "Can the shape be halved in a different way?"
