

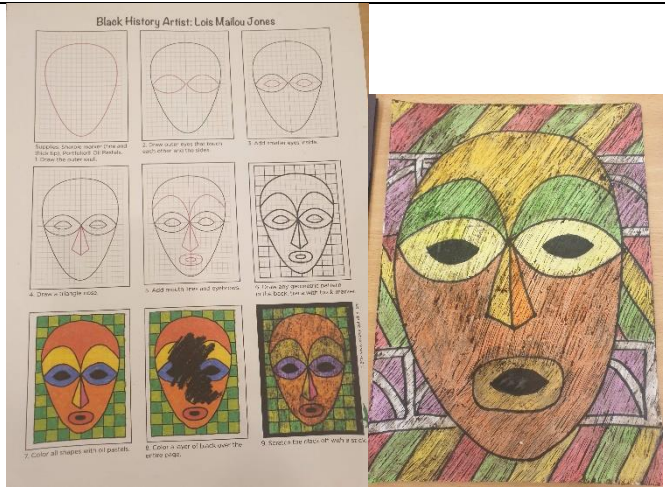
Reception	Week Beginning: 6 th July

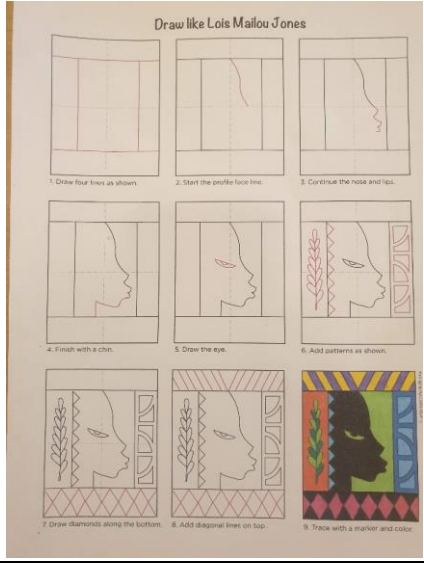
